Week 3, Term 1

It's been a great start to the year here at Discovery School. We welcomed a number of new tamariki and their whānau, as well as some staff. Welcome to Amy Richards (Room 5) and Vicki Howarth (Room 14) who joined our team. We have also welcomed Shaun Bishop (Room 20) and Suzette McVicar (Part time teacher) back from their extended periods of leave.

Our teaching staff are currently working through **new curriculum** guidance in Maths and English. The new curriculum was published very late last year and we are working at a pace that is manageable for staff, while still providing a quality programme for our tamariki. On <u>March 14th, school is closed for the day</u> - this is a *Curriculum Day* for teachers, where we will be working with a Ministry of Education facilitator to work through the first stage of our professional learning in maths.

Te reo Māori is not only a rich, beautiful language, but also one of NZ's official languages. Many of you will know we have been working hard at our kura (school) to grow our use of te reo Māori and do our bit to help it become normalised and revitalised. While our use of te reo might seem like a small thing, using it in everyday settings will help the language grow again. In addition to the work we do in our classrooms, this term the staff are working hard to use te reo as much as possible (understanding that many of us are also learning).

We have developed a list of 10 words that we will use te reo instead of English as much as possible. These are listed below. We are sharing this with the tamariki and encouraging them to use these words and you may like to use them too.

kai - food whānau - family tamariki - children wharepaku - toilet pōtae - hat rūma - room whāriki - mat/carpet ākonga - student/learner mōrena - good morning kura - school

If you are keen to learn more or to hear the correct pronunciation, <u>Te Aka</u> is the online Māori dictionary. You can use Te Aka to look up English words (to find the te reo) and also to look up a te reo word and hear the correct pronunciation.

If you have not signed up to **Hero**, it's really important that you do so in order to keep up with communication. You can do so much using the programme and we don't want anyone missing out on key information. Please see the section later in the newsletter if you need more information and remember, we are here to help if needed!

Vision Update



Seesaw



We use a tool called Seesaw for reporting and sharing to parents. Please make sure that you have downloaded the APP onto your device. Returning students should already be connected. If your child is new to Discovery School, your child's teacher will send an invite to you to connect to their class if they are new. Please contact them if you haven't received an invite. **We would like you to check Seesaw regularly to see updates about your child's learning.**

Dogs

If you are bringing your dog on site at pick up/drop off times, please be aware that some children are fearful of dogs. If your dog is not a calm dog that can cope with the school environment, we ask that you leave them at home or say goodbye to your child at the school gate. Phones & Electronic Messaging Devices

Just a reminder that while students can bring their phones to school, they do so at their own risk and they are not to be used during the school day. In rare instances you need to contact your child during the day or vice versa, all communication goes through the office. We have noted an increased number of children with smart watches - the same applies and any messaging capability should be turned off during the day. If students use devices, they will be taken off them, given to Kaylene and given back at the end of the day. If use is repeated, the device will be held at school for collection by parents.

Sunhats/potae

Being sun smart at Discovery School is very important. All children need to wear a sunhat everyday in term 1 and term 4. We encourage each child to keep a named sunhat either in their school bag or tote tray so that they can be outside during school hours safely. We advise parents to apply sunscreen to their children before school, and then ask your child to reapply it at lunchtime as the weather can be hot at this time of the year.

Nut Free

We have some children with allergies to nuts and nut products. For these children their allergies are life threatening, therefore we ask that **all** nut products are left out of school lunches. Please pay attention to this when purchasing items for school lunches and when filling your child's lunchbox. Your consideration of this is greatly appreciated.

Punctuality

We understand that mornings can be very busy for all families and getting to school can be, at times, a major undertaking. The beginning of the day is an important time aimed at helping students settle in, therefore it is important to ensure your child arrives at school between 8.30 am and 8:55 am each day. By arriving in plenty of time, children have the opportunity to connect with their peers and teacher and to get themselves organised for the day ahead. When students arrive late, they take longer to settle into the classroom and disrupt the learning that is taking place.

Can you please ensure your child has everything they need for the day in their bag? While we do understand that from time to time, things get forgotten, we have a large number of students at school and it is not possible for the office staff to deliver items to the classrooms if they have been forgotten.

Parking, Drop off and Pick up

Please ensure you are obeying all parking signs and regulations when you drop off and collect your children from school. This includes around the Kindergarten and in our school carpark - please don't stop on yellow lines. A reminder that on both Spinnaker Drive and The Companionway, there are parking restrictions, particularly around pick up and drop off times. All parents and caregivers are legally obliged to follow the rules around parking, which are in place to keep everyone safe.

Bike Safety

It has been reported that we have some students not riding bike helmets when biking to school along the walkways. Please remind your children that they must wear their helmets when riding their bikes. While scootering with a helmet may not be a legal requirement, it is also recommended.

Health Consultation

Last year, we surveyed parents in relation to our Health programmes here at school. The survey asked parents about how important different aspects of the Health curriculum were to them. The survey affirmed the following aspects of our programmes:

- the importance of teaching cyber safety and road safety to add to the teaching done at home by parents
- fitness and daily exercise
- the self defence /safety programmes we run at age appropriate stages of our schooling
- the use of programmes to support tamariki in understanding wellness
- water safety
- body care and physical safety

There were mixed comments in the survey about programmes related to puberty, relationships and sexuality. This is an area that does sit within the curriculum and we are exploring resources that fit with the curriculum, while ensuring consistency in practice that is age appropriate. If you would like more information about how this fits within the curriculum, please refer to the <u>Ministry of Education guidance for parents</u>. When we do come to teach this topic, there will be plenty of communication to parents so that you are aware of what is being covered and while we don't recommend it, parents will have the opportunity to opt children out should they so wish.
